**About the Film:** *Wild Ocean* is an action-packed, inspirational giant-screen documentary that explores the interplay between man and our endangered ocean ecosystem. The film highlights one of nature's greatest migration spectacles: Each year a feeding frenzy takes place along the Wild Coast of South Africa, as billions of sardines migrate up the KwaZulu-Natal Coast. Viewers are plunged into an underwater epic struggle for survival where whales, sharks, dolphins, seals, gannets and billions of fish collide with the most voracious sea predator, mankind.

*Wild Ocean* delves into this underwater event and examines the effects that global warming and over fishing have had on the great migration and local people.
